



HISTORICAL MAP of OLD DICKEYVILLE

Frank Page lights lamps except when moon is full



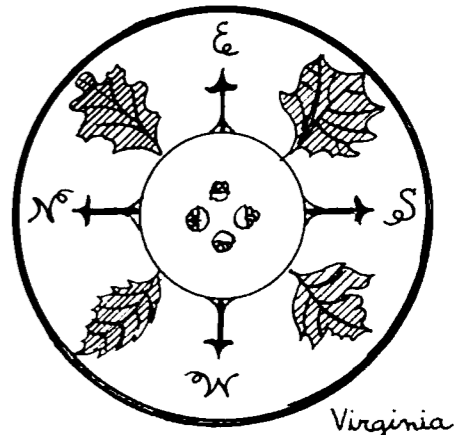
1849 ASHLAND CHAPEL METHODIST



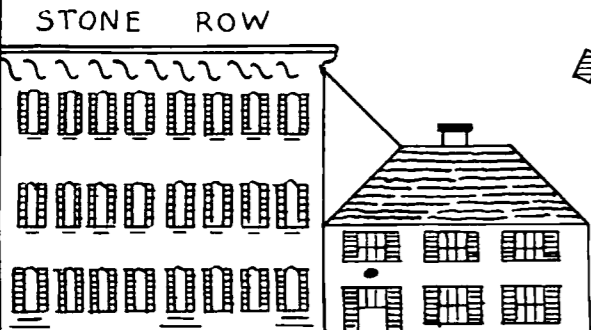

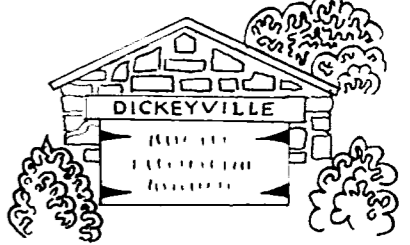
